Based on observation, CCL found that cleaning materials were accessible to the children in care. The child safety locks no longer latched.

706.2. A fire extinguisher must be easily accessible on each floor level. The minimum level of extinguisher classification is 2A10BC. Fire extinguishers shall be mounted near outside exit doors.

Deficiency

The intent of this rule was not met:

Based on observation, CCL found that the fire extinguisher was not mounted near an outside exit door.

1016.1. Age appropriate feeding equipment shall be provided for every four infants or toddlers. This includes safe high chairs, baby feeding tables, booster seats and child-size tables and chairs. Use of these types of equipment must be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and must be appropriate for the age of the child using the equipment. Portable high chairs that hook onto tables are prohibited.

Based on observation, CCL found that the equipment was not being used in accordance to manufacturer's instructions.

- 1005.3. Each infant shall be provided with a crib or play pen for sleeping. At the discretion of the parent and provider, a cot or mat may be used once a child turns one year of age as long as a safe sleep environment is provided. Children one year of age through 18 months who are placed on a mat must have a signed permission statement in the file indicating that the parent has given permission for their child to be placed on a mat. In addition, a caregiver must remain with the child while they are sleeping.
 - a. Infants and toddlers shall not be routinely allowed to sleep in a car seat, infant swing or other apparatus.
 - **b.** Cot or mat surfaces may be of plastic or canvas or other material, which can be cleaned with detergent solution and allowed to air dry.

Based on observation, CCL found that infants were sleeping in a infant swing. Infant was left in the swing for over 5 minutes, CCL instructed infant to be moved right after infant fell asleep, care giver attended to other children first.

A change of diet and schedule shall be noted on each infant's daily diet and feeding schedule.
