If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that a potential hazard existed in that:

* A pink bicycle located on the front side of the play area has tear located on the left middle section of the seat accessible to children.
