#### Finding

591-1-1-.06(4) requires a Center first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that remodel or add to existing plumbing facilities, to have the bathroom area fully enclosed and ventilated to the outside of the building with either an open screened window or functioning exhaust fan and duct system and requires Centers without fully enclosed bathrooms to ensure there is adequate ventilation to control odors and adequate sanitation measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. It was determined based on observation the vents were not in working order in Classroom D (monkey) and in Classroom I (tigers) as required.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will fully enclose and ventilate bathroom areas, as required, and will provide adequate ventilation and sanitation in bathrooms that are not fully enclosed.

#### Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were present: \* In Classroom B (elephants) a staff member's purse was located in a chair which was accessible to children in care.

\* In Classroom C (koala) A +D ointment, Desitin cream, Eucerin cream, Vaseline and insect repellent labeled, "keep out of reach of children" was located in an unlocked cabinet under the diaper changing table.

\* In Classroom D (monkeys) Desitin cream labeled, "keep out of reach of children" was located in a child's book bag in the cubby area.

\* In Classroom F (zebras) a staff member's purse, Lysol wipes and Lysol spray labeled, "Keep out of reach of children" was located in an unlocked cabinet in the classroom accessible to children in care.

\* In Classroom G (hippos) and Classroom H (lion) Anti-bacteria hand soap labeled, "keep out of reach of children" was located on top of the counter top in the children's bathroom.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

#### Correction Deadline: 1/13/2020

#### Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation the following items were not in good repair:

\* In Classroom E (giraffes) one tile was observed to be broken in the children's bathroom.

\* In Classroom C (koala) chipped paint was observed on the right side wall. Boarders around the walls were also observed to be peeling and separated from the wall.

\* In Classroom F (zebras) chipped paint was observed on the left, right and back walls of the classroom. Boarders were observed to be missing from the back wall of the classroom.

\* In Classroom D (monkeys) and Classroom G (hippos) the light fixtures in the bathrooms were not covered.

The light was not present in the joint bathroom of Classroom I (tigers) and Classroom H (lions).

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

It was determined based on observation baby bottles were not labeled with the individual children's name in Classroom A (lambs) and Classroom B (elephants) as required.

An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based on a review of records the driver or other designated person did not immediately document in writing with a check or other mark / symbol to account for each child listed on the transportation checklist form for morning and afternoon transportation to and from Flippen Elementary School on November 8, 2019.

The driver/other designated person will immediately document in writing with a check/mark/symbol each time a child gets on and off the vehicle.

There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on a review of records the second check was not conducted immediately upon unloading the last child during routine morning and afternoon transportation to and from Flippen Elementary School on October 4, 2019, October 11, 2019, and November 8, 2019.
