Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-17(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined based on staff statements that the center's water was turned off on January 2, 2019 at approximately 1:00pm and that enrolled children were unable to wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water because the water to the facility was not in proper working order. Center attendance records revealed that children were present at the facility until as late as 5:00pm.
Correction Deadline: 1/8/2019
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-1.17(8) requires staff to wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for the day, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after diapering each child, dispensing medication, applying topical medications, handling and preparing food, eating, drinking, preparing bottles, feeding each child, assisting children with eating and drinking, after toileting or assisting children with toileting, using tobacco products, handling garbage and organic waste, touching animals or pets, handling bodily fluids and after contamination by any means. It was determined based on staff statements that the center's water was turned off on January 2, 2019 at approximately 1:00pm and that center staff were unable to wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running because to the water to the facility was not in proper working order. Center attendance records revealed that children were present at the facility until as late as 5:00pm.
