If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

290-2-3-.19 Infant-Sleeping Safety Requirements(CR)

Finding

290-2-3-.19(2)(h) requires that infants shall only sleep in a safety approved crib or other equipment approved for infant sleep as described in 290-2-3-.19(1)(a) and shall not sleep in any other equipment, such as, but not limited to, a car safety seat, bouncy seat, highchair, or swing. Infants who arrive at the facility asleep or fall asleep in such equipment or on the floor shall be transferred to a safety approved crib or other equipment approved for infant sleep. It was determined, based on the consultant's observation that an infant was observed to sleep in a bouncy seat that was inside of a pack-n-play on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure that infants are moved to a safety approved pack-n-play and sleep directly on the mattress to sleep.
