If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.20(4) requires the Center to keep medication in a locked cabinet or container that is not accessible to children and stored separate from cleaning chemicals, supplies or poisons. Medication requiring refrigeration shall be placed in a leak-proof container in a refrigerator that is not accessible to the children. It was determined based on consultant observation that perspiration medication was accessible to children in care in that pseudoephed was in a backpack in the cubbies between Room A and B.

Before a change of occupant, each mattress shall be cleaned with a disinfectant. It was determined based on consultants observation that seven of ten cribs in Room C were not tight-fitting and gaps were observed.
