All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- 2) Your name, title/relationship to the facility, e-mail address & up to two phone number(s) where you can be reached
- 3) Specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, along with your concerns or questions regarding the rule citation

Refutations must be submitted to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.03(3)(e) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined that on December 8, 2016, a four-year-old child sustained an injury to the eye which required medical attention when the child kept trying to climb onto the staff's lap while the staff was sitting on a shelf. The child slipped and sustained the injury to the eye. The staff did not properly redirect the child to another activity to deter him from jumping onto the staff's lap continuously.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will review requirements with staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.
