The purpose of today's visit was to conduct an incident investigation and licensing study and to follow-up on the previous visit conducted on August 27, 2019.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined based on observation that the blue chair in Room 111 (one-year-olds) contained a rip in the back cushion and a hole in the seat cushion exposing the inner foam.

Corrected on 1/30/2020 .26(4) - The previous citation was corrected on this date as fencing material was not observed to present a hazard to children. Further, gates on the right and left playgrounds did not possess gaps at the bottom or between each fence gate which would pose an entrapment hazard.
Finding 591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that four tricycles on the right playground were missing rubber handles on each handle bar, exposing a sharp edge. Further, one tricycle on the front patio "tricycle area" contained an area of peeling red paint and rust on the front handle bars.

Finding 591-1-126(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation that two inches of resilient surface was present under the play structure on the right playground when three inches were required.

Finding 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that exposed tree roots were present surrounding the large tree within the sand area on the right playground as the sand has washed away from the bottom of the tree exposing the tree's roots. The exposed tree roots posed a potential tripping hazard.
