## **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.29(1)(a) requires the Center to report a suspected incident of child abuse, neglect or deprivation to the County Department of Family and Children Services. It was determined that the Center failed to properly report neglect or abuse of a child to the Department of Family and Children's Services as required by the Mandated Reporter law as a suspected incident of child abuse was brought to the center's attention on November 8, 2016 and was not reported to the Department of Family and Children's Services until February 9, 2017.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure that required reporting of suspicions takes place, the center will review the mandated reporter law with all staff and the internal procedures for reporting suspected child abuse.

## Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.29(1)(c) requires the center to report to the Department within twenty-four hours or the next work day any child's death while in care; any serious illness/injury requiring professional medical attention; any situation when a child in care becomes missing; any fire; any structural disaster; and any emergency requiring temporary relocation of children. It was determined based on consultant investigation and review of records the child care center failed to report a serious incident that occurred in November of 2016 until February 8, 2017.

### POI (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure that a report to the Department takes place when required, the center will report all serious incident within 24 hours of incident occurring or being reported.
