Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(a) requires that a crib that is safety approved in compliance with Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society of Testing and Materials International (ASTM) safety standards shall be provided for each infant. It was determined based on observation and discussion with staff that only five cribs were available for the six infants present. A pair of twins were observed to occupy the same crib. Although the parents requested that the twins be allowed to sleep together, a crib must be provided for each infant and used solely by one child.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that a crib that is safety approved in compliance with CPSC and ASTM safety standards is provided for each infant.

It was determined based on a review of staff records that two staff who were employed prior to January 1, 2014 and had only a satisfactory Preliminary Records Check on file did not received the required fingerprint determination by January 1, 2107. A one-day letter was left with the owner.

The Center will ensure that every employee hired before January 1, 2014 has a satisfactory preliminary determination or satisfactory fingerprint determination on file and will have a plan to ensure that these employees obtain a Fingerprint Records Check Determination before January 1, 2017.

Finding

591-1-1-.33(5) requires ten clock hours of annual training for supervisory and caregiver Staff, except for independent contractors, Students-in-Training and volunteers, in the subjects of early childhood education, child development or subjects related to the position. It was determined based on a review of staff records and staff statements that one of four employees who were required to obtain ten hours of ongoing training had not received the required training during the 2016 calendar year. The employee had only obtained eight of the ten hours required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will plan and schedule the required 10 hours of ongoing training each year and follow up to ensure the training is completed.
