#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined based on investigative findings that on March 6, 2019, a four-year-old child was instructed by the teacher to sit in an adult size, wooden chair that was not age appropriate. The child fell head first from the chair resulting in the child hitting the front of their head on the floor.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will review requirements with Staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.

# 591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

# **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.12(1) requires each Employee and child in attendance to use all indoor and outdoor furniture, activity materials, and equipment in a safe and appropriate manner and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, recommendations, and intended use. All equipment and furniture shall be used only by the age-appropriate group of children. It was determined based on investigative findings that on March 6, 2019, a four-year-old child was instructed by the teacher to sit in an adult size chair. The chair was not age-appropirate for a four-year-old child. The child fell from the chair hitting the front of their head on the floor.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure Staff are trained in and children are taught the proper use of all furniture, materials and equipment; will implement a plan for this information to be reviewed with both groups on an ongoing basis; and for monitoring proper and age-appropriate usage.

# 591-1-1-.11 Discipline(CR)

# **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.11(2) requires that Personnel not: physically or sexually abuse a child or engage or permit others to engage in sexually overt conduct in the presence of any child enrolled in the Center; inflict corporal/physical punishment upon a child; shake, jerk, pinch or handle a child roughly; verbally abuse or humiliate a child which includes, but is not limited to, the use of threats, profanity or belittling remarks about a child or his family; isolate a child in a dark room, closet or unsupervised area; use mechanical or physical restraints or devices to discipline children; use medication to discipline or control children's behavior without written medical authorization issued by a licensed professional and given with the parent's written consent; restrict unreasonably a child from going to the bathroom; punish toileting accidents; force-feed a child or withhold feeding a child regularly scheduled meals and/or snacks; force or withhold naps; allow children to discipline or humiliate other children; or confine a child for disciplinary purposes to a swing, highchair, infant carrier, walker or jump seat. It was determined based on review of video surveillance that on March 6, 2019, a four-year-old child was being disruptive during circle time and was roughly removed from circle time by the teacher. It was observed that the child was picked up underneath the arms while in a seated position and flopped onto the floor behind the teacher and landed on both knees.

# POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will take immediate action to ensure the action/conduct has ceased; train/review appropriate child guidance techniques with center staff; and have a system in place to monitor and identify inappropriate actions.
