If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(b) requires that climbing and swinging equipment that are not portable be securely anchored to eliminate accidents or injuries and have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment which is adequately maintained by the Home to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation, the fall zones around the swings on the outdoor play area has less than one inch of resilient surface beneath,

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will ensure that climbing and swinging equipment is securely anchored and that there is a resilient surface under and in the fall zone of the equipment. The Home will inspect equipment and resilient surfacing material regularly and repair or replenish as needed.

Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(c) requires that outside play areas be protected from traffic or other hazards by fencing or other barriers at least four feet in height and approved by the Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children. A fence shall be provided around swimming pools to make them inaccessible when not in use. It was determined based on consultant's observation that a potential entrapment hazard existed in that the top pole on the front fence was bent which caused the fence to buckle.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will enclose the outside play area(s) with a four-foot high fence or other Department-approved barrier and inspect regularly to ensure fencing material is safe and any hazards identified are repaired or replaced. The Home will install or repair a fence around swimming pools that makes them inaccessible to children.
