Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.25(19) prohibits the use of unapproved areas for children's activity. It was determined that on February 24, 2017, a group of three-year-old children were allowed to use a playground that was not licensed for center use. While using the playground a three-year-old child exited the playground through an open gate without staff knowledge.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will discontinue use of this area.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined that on February 24, 2017, at approximately 9:18 a.m., a three-year-old child exited the center playground through an open gate. The child was missing for approximately twenty-five minutes before being located at a neighboring elementary school playground. The fence was not secured as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times. Children were not supervised in that on February 24, 2017, at approximately 9:18 a.m., a three-year-old child exited the center playground through an open gate without staff knowledge. The child then walked approximately 0.12 miles to a neighboring elementary school playground. The child was found on the elementary school playground and law enforcement was contacted. Law enforcement responded and returned the child back to the center. The center staff members had no knowledge of the child exiting the playground. The child was missing for approximately forty minutes.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will provide training to staff and monitor to ensure that children are supervised at all times.
