If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.26(7) requires that climbing and swinging equipment be anchored and have a resilient surface beneath the equipment. The fall-zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observations that there was not adequate mulch under the outdoor equipment. The consultant measured less than one inch of mulch under the rock climbing wall and the metal chain ladder. In addition the mulch in the fall zones of the monkey bars and slides should have been at least six inches in depth but measured three inches on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The director will place cones around the equipment to make it inaccessible to the children until more mulch is added. The director will allow the children to use portable outdoor toys and balls for outdoor activities. The Center will develop and/or follow a plan for routine inspections of the resilient surface and for replacing when needed.
