Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.12(3) requires that a variety of age-appropriate toys and play materials be available, stored on low, open shelves accessible to children in each room or assigned area. Toys that launch projectiles, such as dart guns, pop guns, slingshots, etc., shall not be allowed in the Center, and balloons shall not be accessible to preschool children. It was determined based on observation that a variety of age and developmentally appropriate toys and play materials were not stored on low open shelves in Rooms F, I and J. Room A had limited dramatic play and science/nature materials, Room B had a limited supply of science/nature materials, Rooms D and E lacked a variety of toys and materials for the toddler age children, dramatic play, books and science/nature materials.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center director will ensure there is a variety of age-appropriate toys and play materials in each room for each age group. that are stored on low, open shelves accessible to children. Potentially dangerous toys will be removed from the classroom and Staff will monitor for these on an ongoing basis.

Correction Deadline: 6/7/2017

Finding

591-1-1-.12(5) requires center staff to provide table space for each child who is able to sit at a table unassisted and an appropriately sized chair or bench for each child who is not an infant and who is able to use a chair or bench. It was determined based on observation that Rooms D and E did not have a table or appropriately sized chairs for the toddlers.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will provide required equipment as noted.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(6) requires individually labeled and accessible storage for each child's personal items. It was determined based on observation that there were no cubbies or storage accessible for the one-year-old children in Rooms D and E, and cubbies/hooks for the school-age children in Rooms I, J and K upstairs.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will provide each child with individually labeled and accessible storage.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Technical Assistance

Discussed and corrected during the visit: maintaining the playgrounds free of active ant beds, removing pecans and rocks/pieces of cement from Playground B, and ensuring the fence does not have any gaps larger than 3 1/2 inches.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(3) requires that the playground be adjacent to the Center or in an area which can be reached by a safe route or method approved by the Department. Except in School-age Centers, the playground shall have shaded areas. It was determined based on observation that there was no shade other than the building provided on Playground A.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify a safe route or method to reach any non-adjacent playground and submit it for approval. The Center will install structures to provide shade if there is not sufficient natural shade on the playground.

Correction Deadline: 6/7/2017

Finding

591-1-1-.26(8) requires the playground to be kept clean, free of litter and hazards. It was determined based on observation that a 4 inch hole was observed at the back right corner of the playground near the fence.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure the cleanliness, sanitation and safety of the playground, the center will fill in the hole and maintain playground in good condition.
