Finding

591-1-1-.30(2)(b) requires that Center Staff shall not place objects or allow objects to be placed in or on the crib with an infant such as but not limited to toys, pillows, quilts, comforters, bumper pads, sheepskins, stuffed toys, or other soft items. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that one five-month-old infant was sleeping in a crib with a blanket, one eleven-month-old infant was sleeping in a crib with a blanket, a second eleven-month-old infant was sleeping in their own cribs with a blanket.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center director will review the above policy with all staff members and ensure that no items are placed in the crib with the infant children.

Finding

591-1-1-.30(2)(h) requires that infants shall not sleep in equipment other than safety-approved cribs, such as, but not limited to, a car safety seat, bouncy seat, highchair, or swing. Infants who arrive at the Center asleep or fall asleep in such equipment, on the floor or elsewhere, shall be transferred to a safety-approved crib. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that three eleven-month-old infants was each sleeping in a swing. One infant was observed to be sleeping in the swing for 20 minutes. Two infants was observed to be sleeping in their swings for 30 minutes.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center director will review the above rule with all staff and ensure that infants sleep in approved cribs and are transitioned to the cribs immediately upon falling to sleep.
