If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

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Findings Report

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The following information is associated with a Licensing Study:

Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.03 Activities Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.03(2) requires the Center to keep current lesson plans on site that reflect appropriate instruction practices and activities to support children's development The Center shall have sufficient and varied play and learning equipment and materials to support the above program of activities in all developmental areas. It was determined based on observation and staff statements that lesson plans in classrooms A, B, C and D did not include activities for all domains throughout the day and only had one activity planned for the day. Consultant reviewed with the director the need to have lesson plans that cover all domains for each day Physical Development, Emotional, Language and Literacy Development, Cognitive Development, Transition Activities and Social Development, and Increasing Independence and Hygiene.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will keep current lesson plans on site that include appropriate instruction practices and activities and will have sufficient and varied play and learning equipment and materials to support the activities. Consultant reviewed with the director the need to have lesson plans that cover all the following domains daily physical development, emotional development, language development, literacy development, cognitive development, transition activities, social development, increasing independence and hygiene.

Finding

591-1-1-.03(6) requires Center Staff to ensure children less than three years of age do not spend more than one-half hour of time consecutively in confining equipment, such as swings, highchairs, jump seats, carriers or walkers. Children shall use such equipment only when they are awake. Such children shall be allowed time to play on the floor daily. Infants shall have supervised tummy time on the floor daily when they are awake. It was determined based on observation that an infant was left in a swing for one hour without being moved.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to use confining equipment appropriately, to provide supervised floor play daily for children under three years of age, including infants, and will monitor regularly.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(5) requires approval from the Department, local zoning authorities, fire safety agencies and local building authorities for any structural changes to an existing Center or for construction of a new Center. Construction and maintenance work shall take place only in areas that are not accessible to the children. It was determined based on an investigation that on October 6, 2017, an inspection was completed by the Georgia State Fire Marshal. The child care center was not in compliance with the following Fire Marshal building regulations listed:

Siding and insulation missing from Building 2 exposing pluming

- Building 1 does not have an approved fire alarm system
- Building 1 does not have code compliant exit signs
- A restroom in building 2 that appears to be not working
- Building 2 is not handicap accessible
- The mechanical room in building 2 has ceiling missing exposing the attic and wall board and insulation missing
- Exposed electrical wires at the front main entrance of building 1 where a light fixture is missing
- Exposed electrical wires in the mechanical room of building 1 at a junction box
- There is an exhaust fan in the restroom in the corridor of building 1 that is laying on a shelf and has exposed electrical cable coming through the ceiling supplying power to it
- The storage room in building 1 does not have a ceiling exposing the attic and has no wall covering to create a fire barrier
- There is a wood ramp on the rear exterior of building 1 that exceeds 10 inches fall in less than 4 feet
- Building 1 does not have an approved fire alarm system
- The stove in building 1 is a commercial stove without a commercial; hood and extinguishing system
- The gas line for the stove in building 1 is exposed to the cooking burners
- Building 1 does not have code compliant exit signs
- ,591-1-1-.25(5) requires approval from the Department, local zoning authorities, fire safety agencies and local building authorities for any structural changes to an existing Center or for construction of a new Center. Construction and maintenance work shall take place only in areas that are not accessible to the children. It was determined based on a follow-up investigation that on May 18, 2018, an inspection was completed by the Georgia State Fire Marshal. The child care center was not in compliance with the following Fire Marshal building regulations listed:
- The mechanical room in building 2 had ceiling missing exposing the attic.
- The mechanical room of building 1 needed the ceiling sealed.
- There was a wood ramp on the rear exterior of building 1 that exceeded 10 inches fall in less than 4 feet.

The Center will secure the required approvals and plan all construction and maintenance work so it is inaccessible to children.

It was determined based on observation that in classroom B there was a bottle of "Cefdinir" in a child's bag sitting on the floor it was accessible to children.

The Center will train Staff on the safe and proper storage of medication and monitor to ensure that the rule is met. Medication was moved to an inaccessible location.

Finding

591-1-1-,30(2) requires the Center to provide a safe sleep environment in accordance with American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) recommendations as listed in these rules for all infants. Center Staff shall place an infant to sleep on the infant's back in a crib unless the Center has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing another sleep position for that particular infant that includes how the infant shall be placed to sleep and a time frame that the instructions are to be followed. When an infant can easily turn over from back to front and back again, Staff shall continue to put the infant to sleep initially on the infant's back but allow the infant to roll over into his or her preferred position and not re-position the infant. Sleepers, sleep sacks and wearable blankets that fit according to the commercial manufacturer's guidelines and will not slide up around the infant's face may be used when necessary for the comfort of the sleeping infant. Swaddling shall not be used unless the Center has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing its use for a particular infant that includes instructions and a time frame for swaddling the infant. Center Staff shall not place objects or allow objects to be placed in or on the crib with an infant such as but not limited to toys, pillows, quilts, comforters, bumper pads, sheepskins, stuffed toys, or other soft items and shall not attach objects or allow objects to be attached to a crib with a sleeping infant, such as, but not limited to, crib gyms, toys, mirrors and mobiles. It was determined based on observation that in classroom D an infant was asleep in a crib with a blanket.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will take all steps necessary to provide a safe sleep environment for infants as listed in these rules; will train Staff to follow these rules; and will monitor for compliance.

591-1-1-.30(2)(c) requires that infants shall not sleep in equipment other than safety-approved cribs, such as, but not limited to, a car safety seat, bouncy seat, highchair, or swing. Infants who arrive at the Center asleep or fall asleep in such equipment, on the floor or elsewhere, shall be transferred to a safety-approved crib. It was determined based on observation that in classroom D an infant was allowed to sleep in a swing

The Center will only place infants in safe cribs to sleep and will transfer them to a safe crib when the infants are asleep in other equipment.

It was determined based on a review of records that five of nine staff did not complete the full ten hours as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will plan and schedule the required 10 hours of annual training each year and follow up to ensure the training is completed. Consultant reviewed with the director that fire and safety training does not counted toward annual training except for the first year.
