Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on consultant's investigation that center staff did not provide adequate supervision resulting in a one-year-old child being bitten four times. Staff interviews revealed that a one-year-old child bit another child of the same age several times, sometimes breaking skin. Staff stated that multiple interventions were initiated and successful for short periods of time but that the child would continue to bite during times of transition, outdoor times or during free play.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
