591-1-1-.08(7) requires the Center to ensure that children are only released to authorized person(s), and that Center Staff take necessary steps to determine that any such person(s) presenting to pick up a child in care is authorized by the Parent(s) of the child and that person matches the identifying information provided by the Parent. It was determined that on May 2, 2018, a child was released to an adult not listed on the child's release list. The child was taken out of the center by the adult and was later returned approximately 20 minutes later after the adult was notified that they had the wrong child.

The Center will develop/maintain procedures for releasing children and will train Staff.
