290-2-3-.12(7) - No children were enrolled or present on the date of the visit. Consultant discussed with Provider to ensure that monitoring equipment (computer/video screen) planned for use in the Child Care area, will be secured and anchored prior to use with children.

On this date, Consultant observed one (1) of one (1) Play yard, used for sleeping and resting, to meet Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society for Testing and Materials International (ASTM) safety standards. Consultant also discussed all Infant Safe Sleeping and Resting requirements with Provider, prior to the visit and on this date. Further, Consultant observed the correct number of cots and discussed cot and mat disinfecting requirements with Provider on this date.

Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) requires that outdoor play areas be kept clean and free of hazards such as exposed sharp corners of concrete or equipment, rust and splinters on equipment, broken glass, open drainage ditches, holes and stagnant water. It was determined, based on Consultant observation, that unlevel concrete was present on the front and right - side of the patio area, which posed a tripping hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Provider stated that the Home will add soil and mulch level to the patio concrete areas, and will monitor the area to ensure ongoing compliance.

No children were enrolled in the program on this date. The Provider stated that the FCCLH program will provide Transportation and/or Field Trips, upon enrollment of children. Prior to the visit and on this date, Consultant discussed all Transportation and Field Trip requirements and stated to the Provider that the Home (Provider and/or Home Employee; if operating the vehicle), is required to maintain on the vehicle; a current driver's license, complete first - aid kit and fire extinguisher, emergency medical forms regarding each child being transported on the vehicle, and appropriate individual child safety restraints (seat belt, car seat, etc.), in accordance with current State and Federal laws. Consultant also stated to the Provider, that the Home is required to ensure that children are directly supervised on the vehicle by Staff at all times, and that all parental agreements regarding Transportation and Field Trips, are completed and maintained on file.

On this date, Consultant observed a Satisfactory Gemalto COGENT Criminal Records Check Determination letter, regarding the Provider. The Provider also stated that no other persons, age 17 - years or older, will reside, work or be present in the Home, when children are present for care. Further, Consultant discussed all Gemalto COGENT Criminal Records Check requirements with the Provider, prior to the visit and on this date.
