An Administrative Review was conducted on June 1, 2020. Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed. A virtual inspection was conducted on June 22, 2020 with the Director. An in-person visit was not conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Compliance with the Executive Order issued on June 16, 2020 was reviewed during the virtual inspection.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Please see GBI's website located at http://gbi.georgia.gov to access the Georgia Sex Offender Registry.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding 591-1-109(1)(d) requires the Center to ensure that every Provisional Employee has a valid and curred satisfactory Fingerprint Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while its present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center and must be supervised times by a Director or Employee with a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination. The Fingerprint Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Provisional Employ and a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a satisfactory Fingerprint Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on review of records that staff member #13, date of hire December 9, 2019, was present with an incomplete records application. Further review of records revealed that staff member #13 failed to authorize the Department out-of-state records as requested on December 5, 2019. Staff member #13 continued to work a center until June 8, 2020 without evidence of a satisfactory determination letter on file.
