Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children' and needs.
