If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

290-2-3-.08(1)(j) requires the Home to maintain documentation, which need not be filed in the Child's individual record, that the Child has been signed in and out of the Home at each arrival and departure time by the Parent or authorized person(s). The documentation will include at least the following information: the Child's name, date, drop-off and pick-up times, and initials of the Parent or other authorized person. The Home shall ensure that Children are only released to authorized person(s), and shall take necessary steps to determine that any such person(s) presenting to pick up a Child in care is authorized by the Parents of the Child and that person matches the identifying information provided by the Parent. It was determined based on a review of records, that sign in/out records were incomplete for the month of June.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will develop, if needed, and implement sign-in and out procedures that include all required information, will inform Parents of the procedures and will monitor to ensure Children are signed in and out as required. The Home will check records and identification and take any additional steps necessary to ensure children are released to authorized persons.
