Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.07(2) requires Center Staff to immediately notify Parents and obtain specific instructions until the child can be picked up or returned to the group when professional medical attention is required, or when the child experiences symptoms of moderate discomfort such as elevated temperature, vomiting or diarrhea and to notify Parents by the end of the day when professional medical attention is not required, when the child experiences symptoms of less than moderate discomfort or when the child experiences an adverse reaction to prescribed medication which does not constitute moderate discomfort. It was determined, based on investigative findings, that on June 18, 2020, staff members failed to notify the parent of an injured child who sustained eye swelling, in a timely manner. It was reported that the child showed evidence of discomfort at 9:40 a.m. but the parents were not notified until 3:00 p.m., after the child woke up from nap with increased swelling to their left eye.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide notification and obtain instructions as required and will train Staff to familiarize them with the notification requirements and the Center's procedures for following them.
