Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.17(2) requires that Personnel, to the extent possible, keep children clean, dry and comfortable. It was determined based on consultant's interviews and staff statements that the alleged allegation, which occurred June 29, 2017 in the infant toddler room, of child not being clean, cry and comfortable is substantiated. The staff member acknowledged that she was not aware of the child having fecal matter on the child's clothing until the mother brought the clothing back in.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train staff, review regularly, and monitor. Consultant advised the director to check clothing and child regularly after diapering procedures.
