This Licensing Study is the first regulatory visit for Susie's Daycare tis 2017 - 2018 fiscal year.

The consultant reviewed all staff files and finds all staff members have a satisfactory fingerpint criminal records clearance determination letter on file. Four staff members have a comprehensive satisfactory clearance letter on file and three staff members do not have a comprehensive satisfactory clearance letter on file. The consultant discussed that all staff members are reuqired to have comprehensive fingerprint clearance determination letters on file by October 1, 2017.

Susie's Daycare received a Two-Star Quality Rating in June 2017.

The consultant discussed SIDS / Safe Sleep with the infant staff.

All staff members have completed Health & Safety Orientation and Basic Six.

The center owner stated the center provides liability insurance.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. 591-1-1-.08 Children's Records

Finding

591-1-1-.08(1) requires the Center Staff to maintain a file for each child while such child is in care and for one year after that child is no longer enrolled. In order for the file to be complete, the file shall contain the following: child's name, birth date, sex, address, living arrangement, name of school if applicable; names of both Parents, home and work addresses, and home and work telephone numbers; name(s) and addresses of the person(s) to whom the child may be released including address, telephone numbers, relationship to child and to Parent(s), and other identifying information; name(s) and telephone number of the child's primary source of health care; and a statement regarding known allergies, physical problems, mental health disorders, mental retardation or developmental disabilities which limit the child's participation in the program. It was determined based on the consultant's review of six child records that two children records did not have the allergy section completed.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center staff will develop a plan that includes how to obtain all required information for currently enrolled children and how to ensure this is done for future enrollees as well. The plan will also include how and where to maintain files for the required amount of time. The plan will be implemented and followed.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that one of two electrical outlets did not have the protective caps covering the socket. This electrical outlet is located above the child hand washing sink in the grey bathroom of the main building.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to check outlets and replace protective caps when needed and identify and monitor how outlets in use are inaccessible to children.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on the consultant's observation that a infant / toddler playground has been added to the back of building two. The consultant observed sixty-five of sixty-five bolts to be protruding more than two threads and poses a hazard to children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center Director will ensure that all bolts are cut back to no more than two threads in length.
