Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center, During an investigation, it was determined that on July 23, 2018, the bathroom in classroom 5 (Gym A) was out of order and standing water from a toilet leak was observed. Based on consultant observation, there was a black trash bag covering the toilet. Staff stated that the bathroom had been inoperable for several days.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. During an investigation, it was determined that on July 16, 2018, a six-month-old infant sustained a red mark on the forehead while in care. Staff could not explain how or when the mark occurred. Professional medical attention was not received.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
