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Summary Report

Facility

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on an investigation that on August 8, 2019, it was discovered that three-year-old children are allowed to play on a playground structure that is manufactured for children four years to twelve years old.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on an investigation, a three-year-old child sustained a broken arm while playing on the monkey bars on the playground. The fall zone had two to three inches of mulch in the playground area in which six inches is required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined, based on an investigation that on July 23, 2019, adequate supervision was not provided when a four-year-old child fell from the monkey bars. As a result, the child's left arm was broken, and medical attention was required. Two teachers were standing near the door leading to the playground, and neither teacher observed the incident.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
