If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on consultant's observation that there were a broom an a dust pan in the bathroom of room C-3rd Left that were accessible to the children. It was also determined that there was a plunger on the floor in the right bathroom of classroom D-Back. Consultant alerted teachers to move the hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. Previous citation corrected on this date as consultant observed that the front door glass was replaced. It was determined based on consultant's observation that two toilets located in classroom D Back and and classroom E 2nd right were not operation as intended and were covered with plastic and tape. Staff stated that the toilets have been like this for over a month. It was additionally determined that the baseboard under the diaper changing table in room B-2nd Left was separated from the wall. It was further determined that tape that was securing plastic covering of what appeared to be a hole in the wall located about 24 inches from the floor on the wall by the diaper changing table in room B-2nd Left was peeling. Consultant also observed that the plastic covers on the wall in the following classrooms were broken with sharp edges- classroom C-3rd left, classroom D-Back.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on consultants observation that in room E 2nd Right two electric outlets located about 10 inches above the floor on the back wall and on on the right side wall by the door were missing movers.

Playground C not evaluated because per provider's statement it is not licensed and not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area.

It was determined based on consultant's observation that provider had partially corrected the findings from the previous visit. Consultant observed that the gate of the fence surrounding the air conditioning unit was repaired. It was determined based on observation that the gap between the gate and fence post leading to the closed back playground measured four inches. A gap between the gate and fence post leading to the playground with the picnic tables measured between four and five inches. It was additionally determined that the wooden fence on the C Back right playground had a hole that measured three by four and a half inches with exposed protruding nails. It was further determined that there was a gap under the white picket fence on the playground with the picnic tables that measured seven feet by three and a half inches.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on consultant's observation that the playstructure at playground D had holes on the steps that measured two by three inches and the plastic coating on the left side of the steps was broken and exposing sharp metal underneath.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on consultant's observation that there were exposed sharp edges of concrete on playaround D-Front left. It was also determined that there were exposed tree roots on playground C and D. It was further determined that there were two active ant beds located on playground B and playground A.

This training may be counted as part of the annual training requirements for Staff. It was determined based on consultant's review of records that director did not have evidence of transportation training on file.

It was determined based on consultants review of records that 11 of 16 staff did not have evidence of Health and Safety orientation training on file.
