## **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.29(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within 24 hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; and any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children. It was determined during an investigation that on August 5, 2020, the Director or designated person-in-charge failed to report within 24 hours, when a two- year- old child sustained an arm injury that required professional medical attention. Staff were made aware of the child's visit however, staff stated that they were waiting for the parent to provide documentation which was never received.

### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop a procedure so everyone knows how and when to report these incidents to the Department and will follow-up to make sure they are reported as required.
