#### **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. During an investigation, it was determined that on August 19, 2020, at approximately 11:00 a.m., a staff member lifted an 11-month-old infant by the wrist and moved the child to another area. The child's feet were observed to be dangling while being moved by the staff member. The incident caused an arm injury which required professional medical attention. The center reported the incident to The Department in a timely manner.
