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Summary Report

Finding Associated with Complaint

Hinesville Child Care Learning Center

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined that on August 26, 2019, a two-year-old child pulled a wooden shelf on top of the child which resulted in an injury to the child's right cheek. At the time of the incident, one staff member was sitting on the floor, facing the classroom while picking up toys off the floor. The additional staff member was talking to a child about their behavior. Meanwhile, a two-year-old child reached to pull a toy from the top of a wooden dramatic play shelf, at that time the entire shelf fell over on top of the child. When the incident occurred, one of the two staff members was engaged with some of the children in the classroom, however staff were not aware the child reached on top of the shelf, therefore, could not prevent the incident. The child required professional medical attention. Additionally, at the time of the incident, a two-year-old child was observed to climb into a dramatic play sink. In the video footage provided and reviewed, staff members did not immediately respond to remove the child from the toy sink.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
