<u>Comments</u>
The purpose of today's visit is a monitoring visit and a follow up for any previous rule citations. The center does not care for infants and does not provide transportation.

Serious or continued noncompliance may also jeopardize participation in one or more DECAL program(s).



Please refer to the website, http://www.decal.ga.gov/CCS/RulesAndRegulations.aspx, for information regarding October 1, 2018 rule changes about Criminal Records Checks that may affect your facility. In summary,

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

It was determined based on the consultant's observation that the boys' bathroom located on the second floor in the second stall had feces on the back of the toilet and on the rim of the toilet seat and had not been cleaned. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were accessible to children in care. -In the three and four-year-old classroom there was a can of Febreeze under the hand washing sink, a bottle of Germ-X on the window sill, and in an unlocked cabinet a bottle of multipurpose cleaner. -In the bathrooms on the first floor there was a plunger in both the boys' and girls' restrooms. -In the bathroom of the one and two-year-old classroom there was a toilet bowl brush next to the toilet. -In the one and two-year-old classroom there was a bottle of Germ-X. -In the school-age room on the second floor the cabinet was unlocked and a bottle of Grease Lightning, Lysol, and glass cleaner were accessible. Additionally, a broom and dust pan were in the corner. Correction Deadline: 9/16/2019 Recited on 9/16/2019 Finding 591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that one outlet in the three and four-year-old classroom and one outlet in the one and two-year-old classroom did not have the protective covers as required and were accessible to the children in care.

Finding 591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following playground equipment posed a potential hazard to children in care. On the back playground the Little Tike slide was broken on the side and the plastic had sharp edges and there was a metal chair that was rusted and missing the back. Additionally, there was a broken metal pole that was sticking up out of the ground. On the front playground there was a broken play grill, basketball goal, and green riding toy with sharp plastic edges.
Correction Deadline: 9/26/2019
Finding 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not imited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were present on the playgrounds and accessible to children in care. On the back playground there was a mushroom cap under the log at the back of the playground. On the front playground there was an active ant bed that measured 18 inches in width on the edge of the fence on the side of the playground and a second active ant bed behind the playhouse with the purple roof.

It was determined based on observation that in the one and two-year-old classroom there was a dirty pull up and diaper wipe in a trash can that did not have a lid in the bathroom. Additionally, in the special use activity classroom there was no lid on the trash can,.

591-1-1-17(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined based on observation that a three-year-old child did not wash their hands after using the restroom and before returning to play as required.

Finding 591-1-120(1) requires Personnel to obtain specific written authorization from the child's physician or parent in order to dispense prescription or non-prescription medications, except for first aid. Such authorization will include when applicable, date; full name of the child; name of the medication; prescription number, if any; dosage; the dates to be given; the time of day to be dispensed; and signature of parent. It was determined based on a review of records that three of five records had "as needed" listed as the time for the medication to be given and three of five records were missing the dates the medication was to be given.

Technical Assistance 591-1-120(3) requires the Center to maintain a record of medication dispensed that includes the date, time and amount of medication, any noticeable adverse reaction, and the signature or initials of the person administering the medication. The consultant observed four of five records to have no dispense record documented for medication listed for dispensing "as needed" and on one of five records for medication to be dispensed for the week of August 19-23, 2019, there was no dispensing documentation for August 22, 2019.

Additionally, no tornado or lock down drills had been documented for 2019.

It was determined based on observation that there were eleven of twelve mats in the three and four-year-old classroom that had tears on the side with the foam exposed and five of twelve mats in the one and two-year-old classroom that had tears on the side with the inside foam exposed preventing the rest mat from being waterproof and washable as required.
