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Summary Report

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The following information is associated with a Incident Investigation Closure:

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Staff: Child Ratios and Group Size(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(1) requires the Center to maintain the required Staff:child ratios as follows: under 1 year or under 18 months if not walking = 1:6: 1 year and walking = 1:8: 2 years = 1:10: 3 years = 1:15: 4 years = 1:18: 5 years = 1:20; and 6 years and older = 1:25. A Center must establish groupings of children for care with maximum group sizes as follows: under 1 year = 12; under 18 months/not walking = 12; 1 year and walking = 16; 2 years = 20; 3 years = 30; 4 years = 36; 5 years = 40; and 6 years and older = 50. It was determined based on investigative findings that on October 5, 2018, the two-year-old classroom had a ratio of 1:13 during an incident. The two-year-old ratio is 1:10.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will hire additional Staff or reschedule current Staff to meet required Staff:child ratios and will organize children into groups that meet requirements.

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on investigative findings that October 5, 2018, the two-year-old classroom did not have adequate supervision in that the ratio was 1:13 and the ratio for the two-year-old classroom is 1:10. It was further determined that a two-year-old child sustained an injury during the time the classroom was out of ratio and staff were not aware until the child cried out alerting the staff member.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times.
