Advisement of Potential for Repeated Rule Violations during Pending Investigations

However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

591-1-1-.25 Physical Plant - Safe Environment(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on the Consultant's review of staff statements and interview, parent statement, photos, video footage, and the required report that was submitted by the center to the Department, a eleven-month-old child sustained a burn to their leg due to the accessibility of a nearby bottle warmer on May 16, 2019. The child was in the infant classroom and seated in a high chair next to a table where the bottle warmer was located. The child was able to pull over a bottle warmer, containing hot water, onto themselves causing a burn on their leg that required professional medical attention.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items. The center has moved and marked where high chairs can be placed. Bottles warmers will not be left on when not in use and will not be used in the infant classroom unless requested by the parent for young infants.

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.07(4) requires the Center to have a written plan which outlines how emergency medical services will be obtained, including place(s) the child will be taken for emergency care. When a medical emergency arises involving a child, the Center Staff shall seek prompt emergency medical treatment and provide any certified or licensed emergency medical persons with immediate access to the child. It was determined the center failed to call 911 as indicated in their parent handbook when a serious injury had occurred. An eleven-month-old child sustained a burn requiring professional medical treatment and the parent called 911 upon arrival at the center on May 16, 2019.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will complete a written medical emergency plan. and train Center Staff to identify when emergency medical treatment is needed, how and where to obtain it, and to allow emergency medical personnel access to the child.
