

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. 591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation there was approximately three inches of resilient surface surrounding the brown and green climbing structure and swing set on Playground C instead of six inches of resilient surface which was required. A Virtual Visit was conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency. The center will add the required resilient surface and submit pictures to the Department to show correction.

The training shall include, but is not limited to, a review of the transportation rules, a review of approved transportation forms and procedures, and instruction on the usage and completion of the forms and procedures. This training may be counted as part of the annual training requirements for Staff. It was determined based on a review of records two staff members who participate in routine transportation of children did not complete the two hours of state approved transportation training as required. A Virtual Visit was conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Center will ensure that the Director, Center Staff, and any person responsible for the transportation of children has completed the required transportation training.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(8) restricts a child's travel time to forty-five minutes on each trip between the Center and destination unless accompanied by the Parent and excluding field trips. It was determined based on a review of records travel time exceeded the maximum of 45 minutes during routine after school transportation from Hickory Flat Elementary School to the center from August 23, 2021 through August 27, 2021. A Virtual Visit was conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The center will ensure that the travel time is no more than forty-five minutes on each trip.
