- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Please see GBI's website located at http://gbi.georgia.gov to access the Georgia Sex Offender Registry.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that in Room 2, Room 3 and Room 6, teachers purses were stored in filing cabinets that were unlocked and the purses were accessible to children and a hazard was posed.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that on the left side of the playground the fence was no longer attached to three of the poles, that anchored the fence, and there was up to a six inch gap and an entrapment hazard was posed to children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that there were two active ant beds along the left back side of the fence. Further, there were exposed tree roots on the right back side of the playground. There was also a root that protruded out of a tree on the front left side of the playground and there were sharp wires sticking out of the root and a hazard was posed to children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

The consultant discussed with the director that Bright From the Start sent out a letter to all centers on August 25, 2017 that informed them that Board of Education Determination Letters would no longer be accepted. The letter stated:

Alert: Board of Education Determination Letters No Longer Accepted

Federal law requires determination letters for all individuals working in Georgia child care programs to be issued by DECAL. Therefore, we can no longer accept determination letters issued by individual boards of education. Individuals working in child care programs with a determination letter from a board of education must:

- 1. Complete the LiveScan fingerprinting process, AND
- 2. Submit a complete Records Check Application form to DECAL (recommend submitting via DECAL KOALA). Required forms and specific instructions on this process can be accessed at http://www.decal.ga.gov/CCS/CriminalRecordsCheck.aspx.
