- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.06(4) requires a Center first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that remodel or add to existing plumbing facilities, to have the bathroom area fully enclosed and ventilated to the outside of the building with either an open screened window or functioning exhaust fan and duct system and requires Centers without fully enclosed bathrooms to ensure there is adequate ventilation to control odors and adequate sanitation measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. It was determined based on consultant's observation that the ventilation was inoperable in the first back left restroom. It was further determined based on consultant's observation that the ventilation was inoperable in the second back left restroom.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will fully enclose and ventilate bathroom areas, as required, and will provide adequate ventilation and sanitation in bathrooms that are not fully enclosed.

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on consultant's observation the following hazards were observed:

- Classroom A Infant/Toddler A bottle of sunscreen was stored in a child's cubby located on the front left entrance of the classroom.
- Classroom D-Back A bottle of "Off Deep Woods Sportsmen Insect Repellent" was stored in a child's cubby located on the back middle side of the classroom.
- Classroom E-Far Back A bottle of "African Child" sunscreen was stored in a child's cubby located on the front right entrance of the classroom.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Trees located on the site or that encroach onto the site from adjacent properties may have structural issues that present an elevated level of risk. Consider having these trees inspected by a certified arborist to determine their structural integrity and associated levels of risk.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on consultant's observation a five inch opening was observed at the bottom the fence located on the middle right side next to the yellow tubing equipment and a ten inch gap was observed at the bottom of the red fence located on the left side of playground B. It was further determined based on consultant's observation two five inch gaps were observed on the back right side of the fence located on playground B. Consultant also observed the bolts throughout the fence to measure over two threads surrounding playground B creating a potential entrapment hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The center will train staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on consultant's observation the following toys and equipment located on playground B were in need of repair:

- A yellow "Tonka" truck contained rust and chipped paint located on the front left side of the playground.
- The blue and yellow picnic tables contained chipped paint located on the back left side of the playground.
- The green picnic table contained two broken wooden seats located on the back left side of the playground.
- A pink and white "Little Tikes" children's picnic table was missing a leg located on the back right side of the playground.
- The black steps attached to the blue, red, and brown sliding structure contained peeling paint located on the back middle side of the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Correction Deadline: 10/22/2018

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on consultant's observation the following hazards were observed on the center's playground areas:

- Playground A A beehive was attached to the fence located on the back left side of the playground.
- Playground B A beehive and a roach were located underneath the rainbow colored canopy area on the back left side of the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards. The center will also monitor the canopy areas for roaches and beehives daily.
