- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.36(4)(f)1. requires that all transported children be secured in a child passenger restraining system or seat safety belt in accordance with current state and federal laws and regulations and according to manufacturer's directions. It was determined based on the consultant's observation during after school pick up at S.L. Mason Elementary School, that on Monday, March 4, 2019 there were sixteen (16) children in a Ford van, tag number PBY4799, with a maximum seating capacity of thirteen (13) passengers. Additionally, the center had been cited on Thursday, February 28, 2019 due to three seat belts not being operable on the Ford van, tag number PBY4799, being used for pick up. During pick up on March 4, 2019 there were only ten operable seat belts on the vehicle resulting in six (6) children not to have a seat belt as required by state and federal law.

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.36(4)(f)2. requires that no vehicle shall exceed the manufacturer's rated seating capacity and that proof of the seating capacity is maintained on file. It was determined based on the consultant's observation during after school pick up at S.L. Mason Elementary school that on Monday, March 4, 2019 that there were sixteen (16) children in a Ford van, tag number PBY4799, with a maximum seating capacity of thirteen (13) passengers exceeding the manufacturer's rated seating capacity.

Inding Associated with Complaint (1-1-131(13)) prohibits Center Staff from committing any criminal act, as defined under Georgia law, in the esence of any child enrolled in the Center and requires Center staff to comply with all applicable laws and gulations. It was determined based on the consultant's observation during after school pick up at S.L. Mason ementary School, that on Monday, March 4, 2019 the van driver allowed sixteen (16) children on a van with a aximum seating capacity of thirteen (13) passengers. Additionally, the center had been cited on Thursday, abbruary 28, 2019 due to three seat belts not being operable on the van being used for pick up. On March 4, 119 during pick up the van driver allowed six (6) children on the van not to have a seat belt even though a last belt for each passenger is required by state and federal law.
