Finding

591-1-1-.12(8) requires toys for children under three years of age to be age-appropriate; non- toxic and leadfree; too large to be swallowed by a child and not capable of causing asphyxiation or strangulation; free of sharp pieces, edges or points; free of small parts which may be pried off by a child, free of rust; and easily cleaned with a disinfectant daily. It was determined based on Consultant observation that the toys and equipment were not cleaned and disinfected throughout the center as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center staff will provide age-appropriate toys and remove any toys that are not age-appropriate in each room housing children under three years of age. The Center will implement a plan to train Staff to regularly examine toys for the listed hazards and remove toys when hazards are identified and to clean toys with a disinfectant daily.

Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on Consultant observation that there were walls with chipped paint throughout the center. Further there were walls, doors and trash cans that were dirty. Also there were vents throughout the center that were dirty. In addition the floors throughout the center were dirty. As well as the toilet wouldn't flush in Room F.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on a review of records that a second check wasn't conducted on February 18, 2020, for the route from MLK Elementary as required.

The Center will train Staff who are or may be involved in transporting children in how to thoroughly inspect a vehicle and properly complete transportation documentation. The Center will review and monitor.
