#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that on the back ramp outside of the school age building the top railing board has split and there are three exposed nails posing a protrusion hazard.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove the nails and replace or repair the split board. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

#### **Technical Assistance**

591-1-1-.25(7) requires that doors to rooms not approved for child care, other than the kitchen doors, be latched or locked so children cannot wander into those areas. The consultant observed the closet door in Room C to be unlocked. Nap mats and cleaning supplies were stored in the closet. The center will ensure the closet doors remain locked and inaccessible to children in care.

#### 591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the gate leading to the parking was open and not shut. No children were on the playground when the gate was observed open. Additionally, the back fence between the right hand corner and the gate to the school age building is not secured to the ground as required.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were present on the toddler play ground:

- -One active ant bed was observed by the back left post of the covered area posing a potential biting hazard.
- -Three cracks, measuring more than an inch, were observed in the barrier surrounding the mulched area posing a potential scratching and entrapment hazard.
- -Two raised nail spikes were observed in front of the metal green hummer play equipment posing a potential protrusion and tripping hazard.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.30(1)(a)3 requires that each crib shall have only an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant. It was determined based on consultants observation that the crib sheets in three of five cribs were not tight-fitting as required by this rule. SIDS and safe sleeping was discussed with staff and the loose sheets were removed and replaced with tight fitting sheets.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each crib has an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant.

This citation was observed to be corrected on this date. SIDS and safe sleeping was discussed with Director. Director stated that blankets and toys are not allowed in the cribs with infants.

This citation was observed to be corrected on this date. No infants were asleep in the swings during the visit.

#### Finding

591-1-1-.30(4). requires that if cots and mats are stored in the children's activity room or area, they shall be stored to prevent children's access to them and to allow maximum use of play space. When storage is available and used for the storage of cots and mats that allows the cots, mats and any bedding to be stored without touching any other cots, mats or bedding, the bedding may be left on the cot or mat. When such storage is not available for the cots and mats, each child's bedding shall be kept separate from other children's bedding and stored in containers marked for individual use, such as, but not limited to, bins, cubbies, or bags. It was determined based on observation that the mats used for Room B and Room C were stored in a closet with the bedding on the mats and then the mats stacked on top of one another allowing the bedding to touch other bedding and mats. Staff stated that the sheets are laundered once a week.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the bedding removed each day after rest time and store the bedding in individual ziploc bags labeled for each child.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.33(3) requires each staff member with direct care responsibilities to complete health and safety training at the time of employment that will count toward required annual training: Staff employed prior to September 30, 2016 will complete the training by December 29, 2016 and Staff employed after September 30, 2016 will complete the health and safety training within the first 90 days of employment. It was determined based on a review of staff records that six out of six employees employed prior to September 30, 2016 did not have health and safety training as required.

#### POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop and implement a plan to schedule and track this training for all employees based on their hire dates.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.31(2)(b)2. requires teachers and lead caregivers to meet minimum academic requirements and qualifying experience at the time of employment. It was determined based on a review of staff records that one of three lead teachers did not have the required credential or degree to qualify as a lead teacher. A CDA certificate that expired on Nov. 1, 2015 was observed in the staff's file.

The Center will ensure the employee is enrolled in an academic program and will develop a personal learning plan for the employee.
