However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

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Summary Report

591-1-1-.29 Required Reporting**Not Met****Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-1-.29(1) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported suspected incidents of child abuse, neglect or deprivation to the to the local County Department of Family and Children Services in accordance with state law.

It was determined that on June 19, 2019, a soft bump was observed on the right side of a seven-month-old child's head at drop off time. The child's parent was encouraged to seek professional medical treatment for the child. The soft bump appeared to cause the child discomfort when touched. Staff persons also noticed a change in the child's eating habits. The child continued to attend the center through June 24, 2019. The soft bump was still present, and the child had not been seen by a physician. On June 25, 2019, the child received professional medical treatment and was diagnosed with a serious head injury. The director or designated person-in-charge did not report the injury and lack of professional medical treatment to the local Department of Family and Children Services in accordance with state law.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop a procedure so everyone knows how and when to report incidents of suspected child abuse, neglect or deprivation to the County Department of Family and Children Services and will follow-up to make sure they are reported as required.
