#### Comments

The purpose of this visit was to complete a monitoring visit and to follow-up on the previous visit conducted on November 13, 2018.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- · New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. #### **Finding**

591-1-1-.19(1) requires a Center to provide 35 square feet of usable space per child, which will determine the Center's License capacity. It was determined based on observation that the following classrooms exceeded their 35 square feet capacity requirement for the following classrooms:

- Classroom Down Left Approximately 21 three-year-old and four-year-old children were present when the space was licensed for approximately 14.
- Classroom Left Back Approximately 10 one-year-old and two-year-old children were present when the space was licensed for approximately 10.
   Classroom Right Back Approximately 16 two-year-old and three-year-old children were present when the
- space was licensed for approximately 11.

#### 591-1-1-.25 Physical Plant - Safe Environment(CR)

591-1-1-25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation the following hazardous items were observed to be accessible to the children receiving care on this date:

- Classroom Right Back Five tubes of diaper rash cream, a box of latex gloves, two bottles of baby powder, one tube of "Ciotrimazole Cream USP," five packs of baby wipes, and a tube of "Cortizone Cream" were stored in an unlocked cabinet underneath the diaper changing table located on the back left side of the classroom. Consultant also observed a pair of adult size scissors, staples and screws in an unlocked drawer located on the back left side of the classroom. A bottle of sunscreen and a tube of diaper rash cream were stored in a child's backpack in the cubby area located on the front left side of the classroom.

- Classroom Left Back - A staff member's bag observed on the floor with a bottle of hand sanitizer attached to the handle of the bag located on the front left side of the classroom underneath the shelf. Consultant also observed two bottles of sunscreen, a tube of "Aquaphor," two packs of baby wipes, and a tube of "Triamcinolone" stored in several children's backpacks in the cubby area located on the front right side of the classroom.
All items contained the label "KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN."

<b>Finding</b> 591-1-125(17) requires that the Center premises be free of plants and shrubs which are poisonous or hazardous. It was determined based on observation that a thorny bush was observed protruding through the fence on the back right side of the Left Playground. The consultant also observed vines growing through the fence on the back left side of the Left Playground.

Finding 591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following equipment were in need of repair on this date:  - Right Playground - The blue, green, yellow, and orange "Little Tikes" play structure contained a cracked base located on the back right side of the playground. The brown and turquoise rocking horses were missing their handles located on the front left entrance of the playground.  - Left Playground - The blue plastic chain covering attached to the yellow and black swing was peeling creating a potential pinching hazard. The green plastic chain covering attached to the second green and brown swing set was peeling creating a potential pinching hazard.

<b>Finding</b> 591-1-126(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation that the red sliding structure contained approximately one inch of resilient surface located on the back right side of the Right Playground.
Correction Deadline: 5/17/2019
<b>Finding</b> 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that exposed tree roots were observed on the back left side of the Right Playground. The consultant also observed exposed tree roots on the front right side and the front left side of the Left Playground. The tree roots created a potential tripping hazard.

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Comment The director provided two files for two staff members hired since the previous visit was conducted on November 13, 2018. Consultant observed two of two newly hired staff members to have evidence of a satisfactory comprehensive criminal record check letter on this date.
Finding 591-1-109(1)(a) requires that a Center ensure that every actual and potential Director, Employee and Provisional Employee of a Child Care Learning Center submit both a Records Check Application to the Department and Fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site. It was determined based on a review of records that one of nine staff members did not submit a criminal record check application to the department. A one-day letter was left on this date.

Finding 591-1-109(1)(c) requires the Center to ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on a review of records, that an employee with a hire date of February 5, 2018 did not have evidence of a comprehensive records check determination on file. A one-day letter was left on this date.
