If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that on the large playstructure the bongo drum is cracked and presents an entrapment and scratching hazard and on the metal pole to the right of the bongo drum there is a broken metal clasp with sharp edges that poses a protrusion hazard. Additionally, two out of four tricycles were missing handle bar covers exposing the open part of the handle and presenting an entrapment hazard and one of four tricycles had a broken seat presenting a pinching and scratching hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

The emergency medical information record for each child shall include a listing of the child's full name, date of birth, allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications that the child is required to take on a daily basis for a chronic condition, the name and telephone number of the child's doctor, the local medical facility that the Center uses in the area where the Center is located and the telephone numbers where the Parents can be reached. The consultant discussed transportation paperwork with the Director and the importance of having the emergency medical information on the van during transportation.

Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(a)2 requires that a crib mattress is firm, tight-fitting without gaps, at least 2 inches thick and covered with a waterproof, washable material. Before a change of occupant, each mattress shall be cleaned with a disinfectant. It was determined based on observation that three (3) crib mattresses were not tight-fitting or firm, and being used daily in the infant room.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that a crib mattress is firm, tight-fitting without gaps, while being used for infants nap-time.

Recited on 10/30/2017 Technical Assistance

591-1-1-.30(2) states that Swaddling shall not be used unless the Center has been provided a physician's written statement authorizing its use for a particular infant that includes instructions and a time frame for swaddling the infant. The consultant observed an infant in a swaddling sleep sack that was provided by the parent. The consultant discussed the swaddling requirements with Director.
