Comments

This Monitoring Visit is the first regulatory visit for Wayne Head Start this 2019 - 2020 fiscal year. The center director stated medication is administered, no field trips are provided. Routine transportation is provided however the center currently has no bus driver and no transportation has been provided since school has opened this year. Once the school has a bus driver they will resume routine transportation. The bus was not on the property for inspection on this day. The center currently has a two star Quality Rating.

The center director stated two staff members have been hired since the consultants last visit. The consultant reviewed all staff files and finds that each staff member has a satisfactory comprehensive fingerprint criminal records clearance determination letter on file.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that the following repairs are needed:

---One 10 inch by 7 inch metal vent covers located inside of the playground area at the bottom of the building is broken leaving a 7 inch by 6 inch hole. Additionally, the wire covering was lose and not tightly secured.
---A second 10 inch by 7 inch metal vent cover located inside of the playground area at the bottom of the

building has a wire covering that was lose and not tightly secured.

- ---A third 10 inch by 7 inch metal vent cover located inside of the playground area at the bottom of the building was broken leaving a 1 inch by 2 inch hole. Additionally, the wire covering was missing.
- --- The back of the yellow door in classroom 4 is chipping paint.
- --- The back of the blue door located between class 1 and 2 is chipping paint.
- ---One white set of wood door step rails located on the left side of the building when facing the back of the building was chipping paint. Additionally, three wood spindles was missing.
- ---One white set of wood door step rails located in the middle of the building when facing the back of the building was chipping paint. Additionally, one wood spindle was missing. Additionally, one wood spindle was lose and not secured to the bottom of the base board. Additionally, one base board was lose and detached from the railing post causing the railing not to be secure.
- ---One white set of wood door step rails located on the right side of the building when facing the back of the building was chipping paint. Additionally, eight wood spindles was missing. Additionally, two wood spindles was lose and not secured to the bottom of the base board.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards was present on the child playground:

- ---The red metal fire truck was chipping paint. Additionally, one wood board (seat of the fire truck) was weathered and splintering.
- ---The white and yellow metal equipment with the large blue slide was chipping paint.
- --- The orange metal climbing bars was chipping paint.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Between each diaper change, the diaper changing surface shall be cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single-use disposable towel. It was determined based on observation that the diaper changing pad located in the girls bathroom nearest to classroom 6 is not smooth and nonporous.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure there is a smooth, nonporous changing surface that has a guard or rails for safety in each classroom that houses children wearing diapers. Center Staff will be trained and have adequate supplies to properly clean the diaper changing surface between each diaper change.
