If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on consultant's observation the middle light fixture in classroom A/1R and six light fixtures in classroom G/4R were inoperable on this date. It was further determined based on consultant's observation a silver railing was hanging from the ceiling on the back right side and front left side of classroom G/4R. Consultant also observed leakage stains on the back right ceiling in classroom G/4R and dust on the air vents located in A/1R, C/2L, and D/3L.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

591-1-1-7(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined based on consultant's observation two-year-old children in classroom D/3L did not wash their hands prior to the staff member serving snacks. It was further determined based on consultant's observation a two-year-old child did not wash their hands upon completion of the diaper changing procedures in classroom D/3L.

The Center will train Staff on required handwashing for children and Staff will ensure children's hands are washed when required. The Director will monitor for compliance.

The director provided five files for staff members hired since the previous visit was conducted on August 2, 2017. Consultant observed five of five staff members to have evidence of a satisfactory determination letter on file.

Finding

591-1-1-.09(1)(e) requires every Employee hired before January 1, 2014 have either a satisfactory Preliminary Records Check Determination or a satisfactory Fingerprint Records Check Determination on file and requires that Employees hired before January 1, 2014 that have only a satisfactory Preliminary Records Check Determination on file to obtain a Fingerprint Records Check Determination before January 1, 2017. It was determined based on consultant's review of staff files one of 11 staff members did not have evidence of a satisfactory determination letter on file. Consultant observed the staff members to have a satisfactory local criminal records check dated for August 26, 2013. A one-day letter was left on this date.
