If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding

591-1-1-25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined, based on observation, that a staff purse was observed accessible to children stored on top of children's cubbies in the Right Classroom on this date. It was further determined that plastic grocery bags were observed accessible to children both on top of children's cubbies and in children's cubbies in the Right Classroom.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Correction Deadline: 3/1/2018

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined, based on observation, that the door frame to the entrance of the Back Classroom was observed split and unattached causing a pinching hazard on this date. It was further determined that the bar frame between the double doors in the Back Classroom was observed unanchored when the consultant observed the doors to blow open and the bar frame to fall on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring.

It was determined, based on review of records, that the center was lacking documentation of conducting a tornado drill since June 2017 when one is required every six months. It was further determined that the center was lacking evidence of conducting a lockdown drill since July 2017 when one is required every six months.

The Center will hold the drills as required and keep the documentation of the drills on file for two years.
