However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

	Staffing and Supervision

Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined during an investigation that on January 2, 2020, center staff failed to provide watchful oversight and assist a two-year-old child when they attempted to retrieve a book from a bookcase that was out of their reach. The child used the edge of the bookcase to brace themselves as they climbed up a cabinet unit, however, the bookshelf was unsecured and fell on top of the child. The child required professional medical treatment and was treated for a fractured leg.
