- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- · Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times and that the persons supervising in the child care area be alert, able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the chaperones and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. It was determined based on an incident investigation that on September 14, 2020, a two-year-old child sustained injuries to their fingers when they attempted to sit on a table located on a playground area and the table fell over with them. The child sustained injuries to their fingers that required professional medical attention. Supervision and watchful oversight were not maintained by a staff member as the staff member did not witness the child attempting to sit on the table and did not provide immediate intervention to prevent the incident.
