- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

A variety of equipment and toys were observed throughout the center.

Finding

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined, based on observation, that vinyl furniture chairs and couches in rooms C: T-2A, D: T-2B, E: T3, and G: GA PreK were observed to have tears with foam exposed which prevented the furniture from being fully cleaned and sanitizable as required.

- 591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined, based on observation, that the following potential hazards were observed:
- •D: T-2B—Containers of diaper rash cream, jars of petroleum jelly, and containers of Aquaphor ointment were observed accessible to children in a low unsecured drawer in the bathroom on this date.
- •E: T3—Plastic bags and grocery bags were observed accessible to children in an unsecured cabinet under the handwashing sink on this date.
- •F: PreK-3—A bottle of hand sanitizer, two pair of adult scissors, and a bottle of white out liquid were observed accessible to children on top of a low cabinet.
- •G: GA PreK—Plastic bags were observed accessible to children in children's cubbies. Bottles of super glue and adult scissors were observed accessible to children in a low unsecured drawer. A stapler and tape dispenser were observed accessible to children on top of a low shelf.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.
